Get Covered Florida

Signing up for a health insurance plan is an important step in keeping you and your family healthy.

Regardless of your immigration status, **a licensed insurance agent can help determine if you qualify for financial assistance from the government for a health insurance plan** (also known as a subsidy).

This will NOT negatively impact your immigration status and process due to the public charge regulations, which were eliminated in March 2021.



You may qualify for lower cost health insurance if you:

- ✓ Are a U.S. Citizen
- ✓ Are a U.S. Lawful Permanent Resident (Green Card holder)
- ✓ Are asylum seekers (if you've been granted employment authorization or are under the age of 14 and have had an application pending for at least 180 days)
- ✓ Are a Cuban or Haitian entrant
- ✓ Have a Temporary Protected Status (TPS)
- ✓ Have a work or student visa
- ✓ And many other statuses qualify
