

How to **SAVE** Money

on Prescription Costs



Check Your Benefits

- Review your plan to see what your out-of-pocket cost will be for the prescription. You may pay a copay or coinsurance at the pharmacy, or you may have to meet your deductible before your prescription drug benefits start.
- Compare costs of your medication at [floridablue.com](https://www.floridablue.com) or on the app while you're on the go.
- Check other options to lower your cost. Many pharmacies, like Publix and Wal-Mart, offer common prescriptions like antibiotics for as low as \$0.
- If the prescription is cheaper through your insurance, choose a pharmacy in your plan's network. (Members with myBlue must use Walgreens.)
- If you need a specialty drug, call AllianceRx Walgreens Prime toll-free 1-877-627-6337 or CVS/Caremark Specialty toll-free at 866-278-5108.

Looking to get the right medication at the lowest price?

Here are some tips to find the best price for your prescriptions.

Understand Your Coverage

- Many generic maintenance drugs for diabetes, asthma, depression,* high blood pressure or high cholesterol are available at \$0 for a three-month supply using Florida Blue's home delivery service.
- Certain generic contraceptives are \$0 for many women.
- Use home delivery for medications you take for 90 days or longer to save money and a trip to the pharmacy.
- Check the Medication Guide to find out if a prescription drug is covered or needs approval first. To view the guide, log in to your account at [floridablue.com](https://www.floridablue.com) and click My Plan. Click Pharmacy at the top right, then click Medication Guide & Specialty Pharmacy.

More Ways to Save

If you can't afford your medication, you may be able to get help. Try some of these tips:

- Ask your doctor if there's another drug that would work, including over-the-counter options. Most medical conditions have several drug options.
- Choose generic drugs when you can. They have the same active ingredients as brand-name drugs but generally cost less.
- Check the drug maker's website for coupons and rebates.
- Ask your doctor or pharmacist if they know of any discounts or patient assistance programs available for your drug. Sometimes drug companies give them discount cards for certain medications.
- Ask the pharmacist about loyalty programs or generic drug programs that their store offers.
