Cervical Cancer Screening (CCS)

We are committed to working with you to improve the quality of care and health outcomes for our members, your patients. The Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS®) is one tool we use to measure many aspects of performance. This tip sheet details some of the key features of the HEDIS measure for cervical cancer screening.

What is the measure?

This measure reports the percentage of members who have had a cervical cytology screening performed during the measurement year or prior two years.

If a member does not meet this criteria, and is age 30-64, they may meet the criteria if they had one of the following:

- cervical high-risk human papillomavirus (hrHPV) testing performed within the past five years
- cervical cytology/hrPV co-testing performed within the past five years

Note: Evidence of hrHPV testing within the past five years also captures patients who had co-testing; therefore, additional methods to identify co-testing are not necessary.

Eligible Population

Women, age 21-64, who have a cervix.

Exclusions

- Women who have had a total, complete or radical vaginal or abdominal hysterectomy with no residual cervix, cervical agenesis or acquired absence of cervix; prior to December 31 of the measurement year
- Members in hospice

Acceptable Documentation

- For women age 24-64 as of December 31 of the measurement year who had cervical cytology during the measurement year or the two years prior to the measurement year, documentation in the medical record must include **both** of the following:
 - A note indicating the date when the cervical cytology was performed
 - The result or finding
- For women age 30-64 as of December 31 of the measurement year who had cervical hrHPV testing during the measurement year or the four year prior to the measurement year and who were 30 years or older as of the date of testing, documentation must include **both**:
 - A note indicating the date the hrHPV test was performed; generic documentation stating *HPV test* counts as evidence of hrHPV test
 - The results or findings

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HEDIS Measure: Cervical Cancer Screening (continued)

Unacceptable Documentation

- Biopsies do not count
- Lab results that state the sample was inadequate or that *no cervical cells were present* are not acceptable **unless** it is also stated this finding is consistent with a hysterectomy
- Documenting *hysterectomy* is not sufficient; should note if the hysterectomy resulted in the loss of the cervix and include terms like *total, complete* or *radical* hysterectomy

How to Improve Your Score

- Review and document your patient’s surgical and preventive screenings history with results
- Use correct diagnosis and procedure codes
- Submit claims and encounter data in a timely manner
